Dear Mr. Galán-Kercadó:

Reference is made to the Jurisdictional Determination Report (JD) submitted by you, regarding a parcel of land of 175.53 "cuerdas", adjacent to State Road PR-135, in San Idelfonso Ward, Coamo, Puerto Rico. The site would be used for a residential-commercial development called Santa Elvira. The JD was assigned number SAJ-2007-0659 (JD-DD).

According to the study, there is an unnamed creek in the middle of the parcel, which would not be altered by the proposed project. A conservation fringe of 10 meters would be established to protect the creek. No wetland areas were identified on the project. Based on the information provided, and on our analysis, the Preliminary JD is hereby, approved.

However, if any discharge of dredged or fill material into jurisdictional areas (within the unnamed creek) is proposed, such as activities associated with a box culvert, the project would require a Department of the Army permit in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. In that case, the developer might need to submit a Joint Permit Application for the proposed project. Besides the required plans and drawings, we advise that the package include photos of the area on a small scale, with detailed coverage of the creek and its nearby vegetation.

You are cautioned that to discharge dredged or fill material into waters of the United States prior to a Department of the Army authorization would constitute a violation of Federal laws and the responsible party would be subject to possible enforcement action.

In addition, the proposed work may be subject to local building restrictions mandated by the National Flood Insurance Program. You should contact your

local office that issues building permits to coordinate the local building requirements mandated by the National Flood Insurance Program.

The project site may contain species protected by the endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1972, as amended. You should contact your local U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) office located in Boquerón, in the Municipality of Cabo Rojo, Puerto Rico to determine if federally listed species or their habitats are present on your project site. If it is determined that federally listed species may be affected by the proposed project, authorization for "incidental take" may be required. FWS offices can be contacted at telephone number 787-851-7297.


