**AMENDED TEXT TO BE
ADOPTED**

The following text constitutes the amendments to the Racing Regulations to be adopted by the Racing Board in accordance to Law #83, approved July 2, 1988, as amended, which shall be considered at a public hearing to be held the **13th day of March, 2007 at 1:30 p.m.**, on its offices located at 65th Infantry Ave., Corner of Rafael Arcelay Street, San Juan, Puerto Rico, to amend text to Articles 1135, 1151 and 1163 of the Racing Regulations, is as follows:

Article 1135 – The product's Birth Report shall be filed within **one hundred and twenty (120) days of birth**. The report shall be prepared in duplicate and on the form furnished by the Administrator. The Administrator shall return a copy of the Report to the Breeding Ranch to be included in the facility's of Births.

Article 1151 – In order to register a horse in the Imported Horse Register, an Application for Registration and Inspection of Imported Horses shall be filed within **one hundred (120) days** after the date the horse arrives in Puerto Rico. The date of arrival of the horse must be recorded. Together with the Application, those documents that certify the genealogy, identification and ownership of the horse, shall be included, in addition to a certificate of its performances in races,

actions and purses it has won. These documents shall come from the Genealogical Registry of the horse's country of origin, or the competent authority in the corresponding jurisdiction, and shall be duly-attested and authenticated.

In addition, four (4) 3" x 5" color photographs of the horse in four different positions, to wit: Front, right side, left side and rear, shall be included. In the photographs all special signs of the horse must be visible including the hocks. No photographs taken in the country of origin shall be accepted.

Article 1163 - The Breeder, Breeding Ranch, or Owner shall inform the Administrator of the name of every horse that dies, is retired from racing, is put out to stud, is eliminated as a stud, is sold to go abroad, or is otherwise disposed of. Notice shall be given within **one hundred (120) days** after any of the above acts have occurred. Upon receiving said notice and corroborating it, the Administrator shall order the elimination of the horse from the corresponding Register.
